*During the month of February 2008. The Guilford Police Department had the following **Part 1** and selected **Part 2** Crimes reported: Reference Appendix A for further information.*

Burglary Cases

Nine (9) residential burglaries reported. An examination of these incidents revealed the following details; A total of six (6) were forced entry thru a rear door or basement window. Four (4) of the burglaries reported during this period were in the northern sectors of the town. In all but one burglary jewelry and coins was the main item stolen. In one case beer was stolen from the garage. A significant modes operandi (M.O.) was report in five (5) of the case. A suspect and suspect vehicle have been developed in these cases. These case are still classified as active investigations. *Reference Appendix B for graph representation.*

Criminal Mischief Cases:

Fifteen (15) Criminal Mischief complaints were filed with the department period for the month of February. An examination of these incidents revealed the following details Five, (5) incidents were to mailboxes, five, (5) incidents were to private property, and five, (5) incidents were to public or town property. No similarities in cases were found. There was no distinct patterns or modes operandi (MO) in any of these cases. 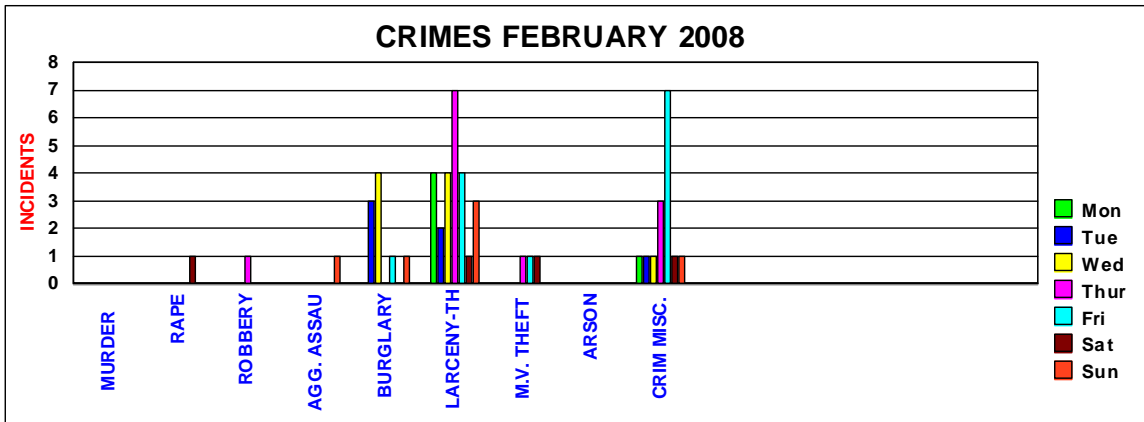

Information and Intelligence received on criminal activity:

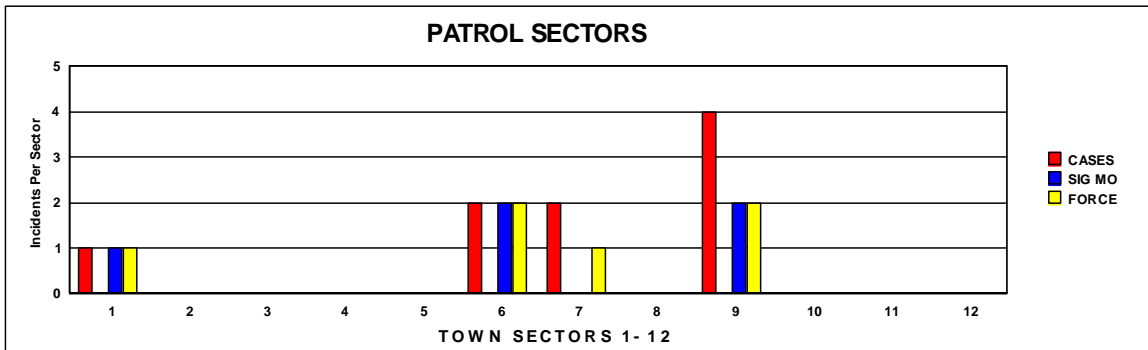
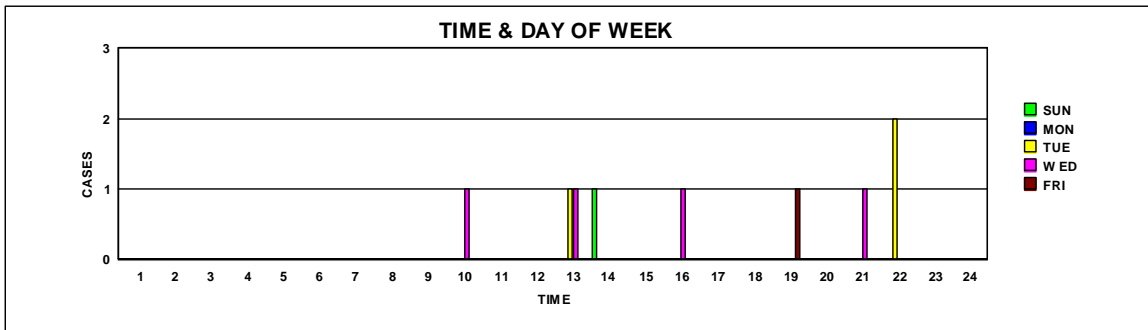
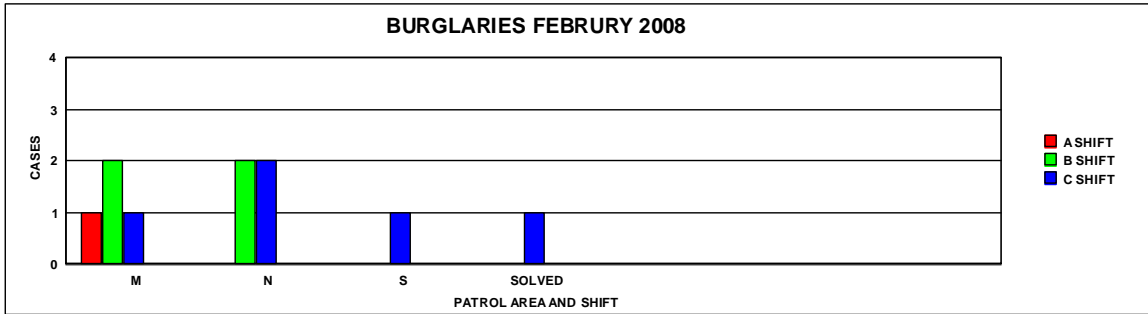
