The Guilford, Branford, Clinton, Madison Police Departments and the Connecticut State Police Troop 'F' Westbrook, are pleased to announce their 2nd Annual Shoreline Diaper Drive! The Departments will be working in a collaborative partnership with the charitable organization "BARE NECESSITIES" to collect diapers and wipes for families in need living here in our shoreline communities. Helping to provide these basic hygiene items promotes better health for both infants, children and their families.
